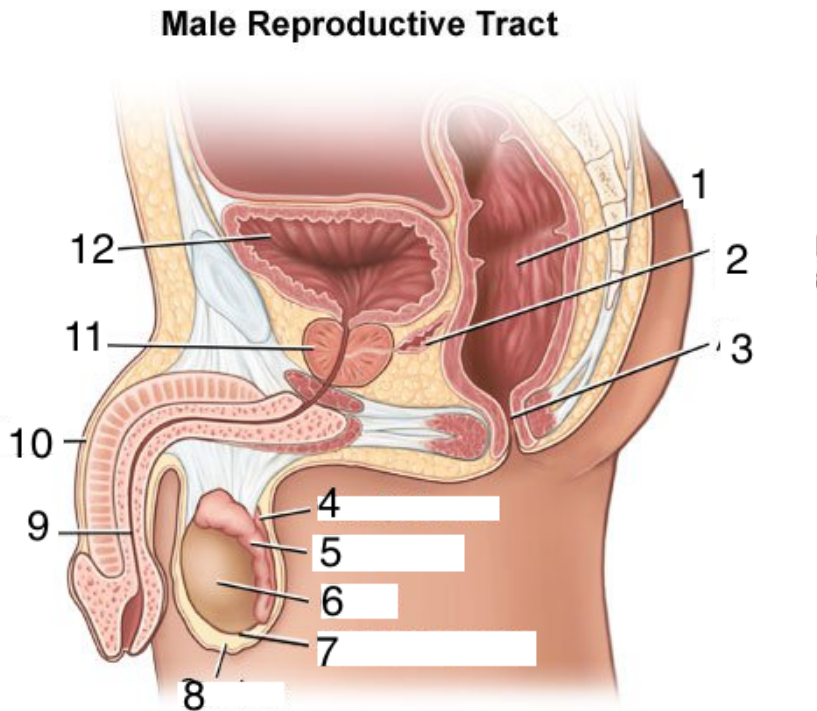




Hour 8:

Part 2 - Baseball:

13. Major League Baseball has seen its fair share of strange trades over the years. Players have been traded for bats, dinner, and even themselves. But perhaps the strangest trade occurred in spring training 1973 involving New York Yankees pitchers Fritz Peterson and Mike Kekich. What made this trade so unusual?

14. On his thirtieth birthday, this MLB pitcher had only 31 wins to his name, despite a 2.56 career ERA. When all was said and done, he ended his career with over 300 wins, demonstrating a remarkable durability. Who was this Hall-of-Fame pitcher?

15. In Major League Baseball, each player and coach wears a uniform number. A majority of teams have retired numbers - that is, taken them out of circulation - for particular players important to their organizations. For example, MLB retired number 42 for Jackie Robinson. The New York Yankees have retired more numbers than any other team, but they have not retired this number, the most-oft retired number that is not 42. What is this number?

16. The last World Series game scheduled for the afternoon was Game 6 of the 1987 World Series in Minnesota. At that time, the Twins played in the Metrodome, so the game was indoors. What was the last World Series to feature an afternoon game played in natural sunlight?

17. The 1994 film *Angels in the Outfield* is actually a remake of a movie from 1951. That version features a last-place MLB baseball team that receives some heavenly assistance, though sadly without Danny Glover and Tony Danza. What team was featured in the original?

18. Speaking of Baseball films, the movie "Field of Dreams," a great movie if we say so ourselves, is actually based on a book. What is the name of that book?

19. The Brooklyn Dodgers tried to make history on June 15, 1938, by playing the first ever night game at Ebbets Field. However, the visiting Cincinnati Reds had to outdo them. What important feat occurred in this game?

20. Of the charter members (eight each) of the National League (1876) and the American League (1901), which teams still exist in their original city with their original name?

21. There is a remarkable amount of parity in baseball today - 29 of the 30 teams have been featured in the playoffs in the last 20 years. More recently, in the last ten years (2005 - 2014), which teams have NOT made it to the playoffs?

22. Baseball is often a tradition, handed down from generation to generation. In 1989, Ken Griffey, Sr., and Ken Griffey, Jr., became the first father-son duo to play on the same team together. Who were the second?
