	7	Number of counties away from nearest large body of water
	8	2020 to 2024 presidential vote swing by county
	9	Shaded area: Sugar maple range. Bars: 2011 maple syrup production by state/province. Full credit for maple.

	10	Number of commercial cargo ships registered in (flying the flag of) each country. Half credit for mentioning trade or ships
	11	Freedom House rankings ("Free", "Partially free", "Not free"). Full credit for any mention of democracy or civil liberties
	12	Uranium mining circa 2023, metric tons. Half credit for mining
	13	Adult obesity rate. Full credit for any mention of nutrition, half credit for other health-related

14	CO2 emissions by country (cartogram area - color is by region and doesn't mean anything). Full credit for any mention of climate change or CO2. Half credit for "pollution" or "industry"
15	Spaceports, scaled by the number of orbital rocket launches (total since 1950). Do not need to answer about the colors, but if you're curious: Orange = active site, grey = inactive site, orange with blue circle = has launched humans into orbit
16	UNESCO World Heritage sites. Must write UNESCO or world heritage for full credit. Half credit for mentioning historical/cultural sites
17	Civilian-owned firearms per capita. Half credit for violence/crime/safety
18	Average flag hue (circa 2024 so only Syria is out of date)
