Name the Supreme Court case given a brief description of what it determined

- 30. This case established judicial review.
- 31. Same-sex couples have a fundamental right to marry.
- 32. Racial segregation is acceptable under the doctrine of "separate but equal."
- 33. Overturned the previous decision, as "separate...facilities are inherently unequal."
- 34. African-Americans whose ancestors were slaves cannot be American citizens.
- 35. A defendant must be informed of the right to consult with an attorney and the right against self-incrimination before police questioning (and waive those rights) so statements made during police questioning are admissible at trial.
- 36. A law banning abortion was found to be unconstitutional, violating the Fourteenth Amendment.
- 37. States must provide counsel to represent defendants who can't afford them due to the Sixth Amendment.
- 38. States cannot tax the federal government.
- 39. Evidence obtained in violation of the Fourth Amendment cannot be used in criminal prosecutions.
- 40. Executive Order 9066 was deemed constitutional, allowing for the internment of Japanese-Americans.
